Gold River and Nootka Sound

We are trying to see as much as we can before we leave here but we are running out of time. Today we headed to <u>Gold River</u> in the Nootka Sound, roughly 90 kilometres, southwest of here. On our way, we crossed through the upper portions of the <u>Strathcona Provincial Park</u> (again) and stopped at the many lookouts and roadside picnic areas with an assortment of wonderful hiking trails leading into the forest. Strathcona Provincial Park is the oldest park in BC and has so much to offer in the way of recreation encompassing over 626,000 acres and it includes 6 of the 7 highest peaks on the island. We hiked a short distance into <u>Lady Falls</u>

, one of several in the park and we enjoyed a close-up encounter with a bald eagle.

At the Muchalat Inlet, we were hoping we would get lucky and see a whale but it wasn't to be today. We did get lucky with the weather though and our day was most enjoyable!
