Once we arrived at the mountain base we ventured to the lodge where we bought tickets for the Eagle Chairlift, which would take us to the top. From the top, we could see the Comox Glacier, Campbell River and Powell River as well as where the forest fire was currently burning.

Washington from Victoria pretty much weekly for almost 20 years enjoying the different seasons and the sports that go with them. We would stop occasionally on the hike down to admire the wild, purple lupins and violet fireweed and pick some of the abundant blueberries and huckleberries that covered the terrain.
