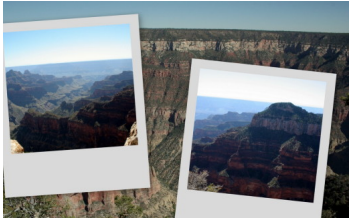


Visiting The Grand Canyon
